Mary Schmidt Campbell has been dean of New York University's Tisch School of the Arts since 1991. Previously, she was New York City Commissioner of Cultural Affairs in the Edward I. Koch and David Dinkins administrations. She came to city government after having served as executive director of the Studio Museum in Harlem for ten years. Currently in addition to serving as dean of the Tisch School, she is the Associate Provost for the Arts at NYU where she oversees university-wide initiatives in the arts.

During Dean Campbell's tenure, the Tisch School has tripled the number of applications, making it one of the most selective schools at NYU, developed advanced international studies in the arts, created vital relationships with New York City cultural institutions such as Dance Theater Workshop, the Public Theater and the Baryshnikov Art Center, and renovated over

two-thirds of the school's teaching facilities. The school counts among its faculty and alumni Pulitzer Prize, Academy Award, Tony, Obie, and Bessie award winners as well as Guggenheim Fellows and Fellows of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Dean Campbell holds a B.A. degree in English literature from Swarthmore College, an M.A. in art history from Syracuse University, and a Ph.D. in humanities, also from Syracuse. She is co-author of *Harlem Renaissance: Art of Black America* (New York: Harry N. Abrams, Inc., 1987) and *Memory and Metaphor: The Art of Romare Bearden, 1940-1987* (New York: Oxford University Press & The Studio Museum in Harlem, 1991). She sits on the boards of The American Academy in Rome, the New York Shakespeare Festival, and the United Nations International School. In the fall of 2001 she was inducted into the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
