Shelby White has, for many years, made a significant impact on the literary, art, financial, and non-profit arenas in New York City. Her insightful book, *What Every Woman Should Know About Her Husband's Money*, was published by Random House and she has authored numerous articles on finance, philanthropy and art collecting that have appear in such publications as *The New York Times*, *Town and Country*, *Redbook* and *Forbes*. She has taught on philanthropy at New York University and on museum studies at City College.

Ms. White and her late husband, Leon Levy, had a passionate interest in the ancient world and their philanthropy was focused on this. They supported archaeological excavations, museum exhibitions, and conservation. In 1997 they founded the Shelby White-Leon Levy Program for Archaeological Publications at Harvard University which has to date awarded \$10 million in grants. They also sponsored the excavations at the ancient Canaanite city of Ashkelon, Israel for the past 17 years. The couple also provided major funding for the Leon

Levy and Shelby White Court at The Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Upon the death of her husband, Ms. White started the Leon Levy Foundation to continue his legacy. The Foundation continues their interest in archaeology, mind brain research, human rights, and preservation. In 2006 the Foundation established the Institute for the Study of the Ancient World at New York University. The Institute will serve as a center for advanced scholarly research and graduate education intended to cultivate cross-cultural study of the ancient world from the western Mediterranean to China.

Ms. White received her BA from Mount Holyoke and her MA from Columbia University and serves on the boards of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The Institute for Advanced Study, The New York Botanical Garden, The Mount Holyoke College Art Museum, The Bard Graduate Center, and the Writers Room. She is president of both the American Friends of the Cycladic Art Foundation and the American Friends of the Israel Antiquities Authority.
